
Don't Forget to Get Your Permit

Get all the permit information you need before starting your next home or business project. The Village of Edmore staff can answer your questions about the building, zoning and permitting process and guide you through the details so that your home or business not only looks great when you are done with your project but can be done right. Zoning permits can be obtained through the village office or online. Building permits can be obtained through the Village office partment. Because your home or business is an investment if your construction project does not comply with Village codes, the value of your investment is reduced. Property insurers may not cover work done without permits and inspections. If you decide to sell a home or building that has had modifications without a permit, you may be required to make costly repairs. Also, by following code guidelines, the completed project will meet minimum standards of safety and will be less likely to cause injury to you, your family, your friends or future owners. If you are hiring an outside contractor for your next home project, please make sure whoever you hire is licensed and insured.

If you are planning to do work such as landscaping or excavating please contact MISS DIG at least 3 business days prior to conducting excavation on your property. Contact MISS DIG at 1-800-482-7171 or 8-1-1 MISS DIG will notify the public utilities in your area so that they can locate and mark the approximate location of underground lines they own and operate within your proposed work area.

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Police Chief's Corner

Crime Prevention Safety Tips

With the arrival of Spring people will be out and about in the village but not everyone has the same intention of enjoying the warm weather. Review the following crime prevention safety tips in order to familiarize yourself in ways to help prevent crimes of opportunity.

- Always lock doors and windows before leaving the house. Always lock deadbolt locks.
- If you have an attached garage, be sure to lock the inside door between your garage and house. If you have a detached garage, keep it secured.
- Lock your car doors while at home, even if cars are stored inside your garage or parked in the driveway.
- Keep your garage door closed.
- Remove valuables from vehicles.
- Install secure window well covers.
- If you have double-hung or sliding windows or doors, place a wooden rod or stick in the track.
- Use timers for your lights if you come home after dark.
- If you are going on vacation, be sure to stop mail service and cancel newspapers so they don't pile up in front of your home while you are away.
- Be on the lookout and report suspicious vehicles that look out of place.

Remember, burglars can be male or female, young or old, and driving any type of vehicle. The Village of Edmore remains a very safe community, and we all must work together to keep it that way. Call 911 immediately with details, descriptions and plate numbers if you see:

- Any suspicious vehicles driving slowly or repetitively through your neighborhood.
- Observe someone at a neighbor's front door, then see them walking to the side or rear of the house.
- Someone rings your doorbell "by mistake." Burglars never just break in they always ring the bell to see if anyone is home.

Water Rate

The Village Council approved increases of the village water rate at the April 14th council meeting. New rates will take effect May 1st and will be reflected on the July water bill. The rates are being increased 6% (plus Consumer Price Index) to cover improvements to be undertaken over the next few years to reduce long term operating costs, ensure quality and reliability. Water funds are considered to be "enterprise funds" in that the costs of operations, maintenance, and capital expenditures for water infrastructure must be paid by users and not through property taxes. For residential users the rate increase amounts to \$3.62 a quarter or \$14.48 per year. For commercial users the rate increase will be 6% + (CPI) and based on usage. The Village of Edmore currently has the lowest rates in the region and is one of only a few communities in the state that does not meter water residentially. The Village of Edmore DPW will continue to take steps to ensure it has clean, reliable water for its residents and users in the years to come.

Water Confidence Reports will be available at the Village Office in late July -Early August.

Did you know?

The average amount of water used by 1 person in the U.S. per day is 100 gallons. 70 % of it is used indoors.

HYDRANT FLUSHING TO START MAY 26

Starting May 26 through June 6 the DPW will be flushing fire hydrants throughout the village. To reduce the demand on the water system and cause fewer disturbance this routine maintenance will be completed between 10pm-6am.

May 13 will be Spring Clean-up in the Village. Please remember ALL bags MUST be tagged. No tires, construction debris, chemicals etc. are accepted.

Chip sealing of village streets will be completed this summer on Gilson Street between First and Sheldon. There is no tentative start date as of yet. More information will be made available online.

DPW will be filling potholes as they form. If you see a pothole that needs to be filled. Please contact the DPW @ 427-3747

DPW personnel will be highly visible this season wearing neon green shirts with the Edmore Logo.

Yard Waste is collected for free each Tuesday of the month and brush collection/chipper service is provided the 2nd Tuesday of the Month to all single family residential properties April through November. Yard waste must be in a yard waste bags that are available at the Village Offices for only ¢50. Trash bags and tags are available for \$1.00.

To ensure the safety of DPW employees, equipment and efficiency in offering this service the DPW Supervisor suggests following these guidelines:

- $\Rightarrow\,$ Brush shall be placed in the front yard at the edge of the public street with ends sticking out.
- $\Rightarrow~$ No limbs larger than 4 inches in diameter will be accepted.
- $\Rightarrow~$ Piles of brush should be stacked neat and orderly and under four feet in height.
- $\Rightarrow\,$ No vines or loose leaves will be accepted, lawn bag are available for purchase at the village office.
- \Rightarrow Brush intertwined with plastics will not be accepted.
- \Rightarrow No metal or wire (fencing, electrical cable, root balls, etc) will be accepted.
- \Rightarrow No lot clearing debris or whole tree or that from a byproduct of commercial cutting/trimming will be accepted.
- $\Rightarrow\,$ Leaf season starts October to early December. During this period please place your leaves at the curb.
- \Rightarrow Limit the weight of bags to less than 50 lbs.
- \Rightarrow Place by the curb by 7:30am.

Postcards from Edmore's Past



The depot served as the junction of the north-south line and the east-west line. It was located in the lawn east of where Railroad Street curves to the south, on the southeast side of the rail junction. There were two wye tracks to allow interchange between the lines. Today, this railroad grade that goes from Greenville through Edmore then east to Alma is the Fred Meijer Heartland Trail.
