

## Cemetery Rules and Regulations (Summary)

### Lot Care and Maintenance

- Seasonal Grave Decorations are allowed (grave blankets, November 1<sup>st</sup>) & (potted flowers April 1<sup>st</sup>.)
- Seasonal grave decorations not removed by these dates may be removed without notice to the owner.
- All flowers, containers, and decorations are to be set on concrete bases and no glass containers are allowed.
- No tree of any type shall be planted. The mounding of graves is prohibited. Surfaces other than earth or sod are prohibited.
- The Village may remove or trim any plant, tree or shrub in the interest of maintaining proper use and appearance of the Cemetery.

- The DPW will remove any growth, emblems, flags, displays, containers, or decorations that become deteriorated, a source of litter, or a maintenance problem.

### Monuments and Markers

- Markers identify those buried in a single burial space; monuments identify those buried in a lot of 2 or more adjoining burial spaces.
- No more than 1 monument shall be placed on a lot or more than 1 marker on a burial space.
- A veteran marker may be placed flush with the ground on a burial space with a monument or marker.
- Foundations will be at a minimum the same size of the marker or monument.
- Monuments and markers shall be placed on a foundation installed by the cemetery sexton; foundations will be paid for in advance.

### Interments and Disinterments

- No burial will take place until all fees and charges have been paid in full.
- All burials and disinterments will be completed by the cemetery sexton.
- Saturday and Sunday, as well as after hours (any opening or closing past 3:30pm) and Holidays will have an additional charge.
- There will be an additional charge for all grave openings that take place November 1<sup>st</sup> - April 1<sup>st</sup>

### Lot Purchases and Transfers

Lots may only be purchased or transferred through the Village Offices.

### General Rules

- Alcoholic beverages are prohibited, except with prior approval in conjunction with established burial customs.
- Pets shall be leashed and owners are responsible for clean up.
- All trash, trimmings, etc. shall be placed in provided containers. The Cemetery is open to the public between dawn and dusk every day of the year.

## Cemetery Administration

Lot purchases, interment arrangements and services, placing of monuments and markers, and review of Cemetery records can be arranged by contacting the Edmore Village Office during regular business hours.

It is the Village's goal to maintain Vinewood Cemetery as a beautiful and peaceful resting place for the deceased. The Village has established Rules and Regulations to provide the public with a uniform ability to pay respect to those interred, and to preserve the beauty and provide for the orderly development of Vinewood Cemetery.

## Cemetery History

Vinewood Cemetery located on First Street or Wyman Rd. (County Rd. 571) in the Village of Edmore is owned and operated by the Village of Edmore. The first burials date from as early as the 1890's. It has been expanded over the years and now is roughly ten acres.



The wooded setting is the resting place of more than 3000 and currently has several sections with numerous available plots with years of interment space. Our experienced, compassionate village staff provides exceptional support to making end-of-life arrangements at the time of need or when planning for the future.
